

"Ecclesia: Called Out, Called Together"

"If we seek Christian impact on the world... the only answer is a congregation of men and women who believe the gospel, and live by it." - Lesslie Newbigin

If you were on a mission to reclaim a lost and sinful world, what would be your strategy? Would you write messages in the sky? Would you use bullhorns and microphones? Send a powerful army? Make new rules and enforce obedience? How would you reach a world gone wrong?



God's strategy may seem strange to us, but here it is: *God formed the church*. You and me, and all who are called "Christians," are the means by which God is bringing his redeeming work into our world. The New Testament word for "church" is the greek word "ecclesia," which means "called." In the ancient world, when an assembly was to be gathered for a speech or political event, a messenger would go out into the community and call out the invitation. When the church was formed, this same dynamic was at work: the church is the assembly of *those who have been called* – called by God – called to come apart from the world, and to come together in a new community.

The church is unique. It's not a social club, though it creates deep friendships. It's not a service agency, though it seeks the wellbeing of others. It's not a political interest group, professional guild, or intellectual society, though it impacts the politics, work and thought life of its people. There is no other assembly quite like it! This spring we'll be diving deep into a single chapter of the bible: Acts Chapter 2. The chapter tells the story of the church's birth. On the day of Pentecost, God's word goes out through the voice of his apostles who are filled with his Spirit, and a new community is born. They are a diverse group, brought together by the story of Jesus and the reality of his resurrection. Together they experience his living presence and power in ways that shape a strange new kind of life. They share everything. They read ancient scriptures and gather in homes to eat bread and wine which represent the body and blood of their Lord. They make surprising choices, living lives of hardship and sacrifice while experiencing deep joy. The world looks on and is intrigued. Many join in. The church is born!

And we're still going strong, two thousand years later. The story of Acts 2 is our DNA. We carry the same message, we're called to the same strange new life, and we're equipped with the same power. Our fellowship here at Oak Hills may seem humble, but we carry a distinguished pedigree – we are the offspring of Peter, James and John, of Pheobe, Prisca and Junia. We are the heirs of the great cloud of witnesses that has come before. We are the "ecclesia" – called by God to stand out from our world, and to stand together in Christ, living his grace and speaking the truth. According to God's wise design, we can only do this together. We need each other. In our worship and ministry, fellowship and service, we become a display of the gospel to our world.

Its been said that the church is God's "plan A" and there is no plan B. Our fellowship matters. May we heed the call, and come together, for the sake of his kingdom.


